DEFINITION OF BROWNFIELDS

Real property, the expansion, redevelopment, or reuse of which may be complicated by the presence or potential presence of hazardous substance pollutant, or contaminant.



ILLEGAL DUMP SITES

Illegal Dumping on Pine Ridge Reservation

Illegal dumping is the unlawful disposal of commercial and industrial waste in places other than permitted facilities such as landfills or transfer stations. Garbage is usually dumped along roadways, vacant lots and on tribal, public and private lands. If you see someone littering or dumping waste you should tell them to stop immediately, or report them to the authorities.

Reasons for Illegal Dumping :

- Lack of respect for the people
- Lack of respect for the land
- Lack of convenient legal dump sites
- Lack of Public awareness about the issue
- Lack of understanding of Tribal Laws prohibiting these activities

PUBLIC LAW NO. 107-118, 115 STAT. 2356, "THE BROWNFIELDS LAW"

On January 11, 2002, President Bush signed the small business Liability Relief and Brownfields Revitalization Act. The Brownfields Law amended the Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation, And Liability Act (CERCLA or Superfund) by providing funds to assess and cleanup brownfields; clarified CERCLA liability protections; and provided funds to enhance state and tribal response programs. Other related laws and regulations impact brownfields cleanup and reuse through financial incentives and regulatory requirements.
